

DRAFT Appendix 3 - J/100 Class East Coast Championship Notes

The J/100 Class East Coast Championship will be held at the 152nd NYYC Annual Regatta from June 9-11, 2006 and will consist of racing over three days, starting with the Round the Island Race with signals posted at noon on Friday, followed by course races on Saturday and Sunday.

Scoring: If there are not enough J/100s to form their own one-design class, the J/100s will compete within a PHRF Class with a rating of 93. If so, the winner of the inaugural J/100 Class East Coast Championship Trophy will be the yacht with the lowest point score counting only J/100s (disregarding other PHRF boat's finish positions) and will count all races on all three days with no discard race. [Note that it is possible that one boat will finish higher than another in the PHRF final results, yet lower in the J/100 Class East Coast Championship results.]

Other Trophies: If the J/100s are competing within a PHRF class, they will qualify to win PHRF Class and Overall prizes in addition to the East Coast Championship Trophy. If the J/100s have enough boats for their own class, then they will be eligible for prizes in accordance with the 152nd Annual Regatta Sailing Instructions.

Class Rules: All participants shall obtain a PHRF NB Certificate with a One-Design rating of 93 using Class jib (no genoa) and not more than 3 class legal asymmetric spinnakers with an area not to exceed 80 m². The Class Crew Weight limit when sailing with spinnakers is 990 lbs. and shall be used. There will be no crew weigh-in.
