Notice of Race

1. RULES

- 1.2 New York Yacht Club is the Organizing Authority.
- 1.2 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*, including Appendix E – Radio-Controlled Boat Racing Rules for the CR-914 Class.
- 1.3 The Protest Committee may impose suitable penalties, other than disqualification, for violations of any non-Part 2 rule. This changes RRS 64.1.

2. ELIGIBILITY

The Regatta is open to all eligible yachts with the following qualifications:

- All PHRF Class competitors having a valid 2010 PHRF-NB rating certificate for spinnaker, or non-spinnaker classes.
- All IRC yachts shall have a valid 2010 IRC rating certificate.
- All Classic yachts sailing in the Classic division shall have a valid CRF rating certificate.
- All One-Design Class competitors having five or more boats in their respective classes (i.e., but not limited to: Swan 42, 12 metres, J/24, J/27, J/29, J/80, J/105, J/109, J/30, J/35, Farr 30, Melges 24, Melges 32, Ensign, Etchell 22, Shields, ‘S’ class, etc).
- CR-914 Class model yachts.

3. ENTRY PROCEDURE & FEES

- 3.1 Entries should be submitted online at www.leukemicup.org/ri or by submitting the entry form available in the official regatta brochure.

- 3.2 Entry Fees:

- 3.3 The regatta fee includes the race entry fee and, except for the CR-914 class, one ticket to the Saturday night barbeque. Additional dinners may be purchased in advance for \$35.00 each.
- 3.4 Entries must be received by 1700 Wednesday, June 2, 2010 to guarantee inclusion on the scratch sheet.
- 3.5 Handicap class yachts shall submit a current rating certificate to be considered a starter in the regatta. Rating certificates should be mailed to New York Yacht Club; Sailing Office; 5 Halidon Avenue; Newport, RI 02840; faxed to (401) 846-3303; or dropped off at the Sailing Office no later than the close of registration.

4. EVENT HEADQUARTERS

Event Headquarters will be the Sailing Center at New York Yacht Club Harbour Court. Post-race parties/auctions and awards ceremony will be at New York Yacht Club.

5. SCHEDULE

Racing will begin at 1200 noon on Saturday; other details of the race schedule will be announced in the sailing instructions.

6. RACING

Classes will be divided into appropriate divisions for optimum racing. Handicap and One-Design classes will race on Narragansett Bay using the South Bay Racing Chart that will be supplied at registration. Courses will be designated in the sailing instructions. The Race Committee will determine the number of races and courses for each class based upon weather and sea conditions.

7. DOCKAGE, MOORINGS, LAUNCHING

Dockage and moorings may be available on a first come first served basis by contacting the New York Yacht Club Sailing Office. Reservations are required. Contact Joyce Pastore for details. One-Design keel boats may launch from Sail Newport at Fort Adams.

8. SCORING

The Low Point Scoring System Appendix A of the Racing Rules will apply, as modified by the Sailing Instructions. Each yacht's total score will be the sum of her scores for all races. There will not be a throw-out provision for any class. A minimum of one race shall constitute a series.

9. PENALTY SYSTEM

Rules 44.1 and 44.2 are changed so that only one turn, including one tack and one gybe, is required.

10. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The sailing instructions will be available online www.nyyc.org/leukemicupjune/ and www.leukemicup.org/ri seven days prior to the race and at registration on Friday, June 4, 2010 starting at 1700 at the New York Yacht Club Sailing Center.

11. PRIZES

Prizes to be awarded to the first place yacht in each class. Prizes will be awarded to the second and third place yacht in a class if there are four or more entries

12. WAIVER OF LIABILITY

- 12.1 Competitors participate in this regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. The Organizing Authority, Leukemia & Lymphoma Society, affiliated companies, and other sponsors will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.
- 12.2 All yachts participating in the regatta, regardless of class designation, must submit a Waiver of Liability signed by the skipper and all crew members prior to racing. The Waiver of Liability form can be found online on the regatta web page and will be available at registration. In the event of crew substitution, the new crew member must submit a signed waiver to the Event Headquarters prior to racing. Failure to comply invalidates the yacht's entry.
