QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS: A QUERY FROM TEAM CANADA SEPTEMBER 20, 2005

Q1) Can we bring aboard duct tape as well as electrical tape?

A1) It is not envisaged competitors bring this sort of equipment as boats are swapped regularly and are to be sailed as supplied.

Q2) Can we bring on board tell tale material (less than 3mm) and put tell tales on shrouds and boat?

A2) It is not envisaged competitors bring this sort of equipment as boats are swapped regularly and are to be sailed as supplied.

Q3) Can we mark sheets with wools or thread rather than tape?

A3) It is not envisaged competitors bring this sort of equipment as boats are swapped regularly and are to be sailed as supplied.

Q4) Can we bring on spare bolts, pins, Clevis pins or will we be expected to have these things?

A4) It is not envisaged competitors bring this sort of equipment as boats are swapped regularly and are to be sailed as supplied. However, as indicted in SI Appendix 1 Section 2 some sailors may choose to carry those items allowed aboard.

Q5) Will bailers be supplied or are we to bring our own, or can we?

A5) Vanguard 15s are self-bailing and bailers will not be supplied. You may however choose to bring your own as permitted by the Sailing Instructions Appendix 1.

Q6) I assume the boats will have supplied safety equipment (paddle, etc. [ex. PFD's which are our responsibility]) or is that required? (In Canada you have to have a list of safety equipment on board).

A6) Competitors only need to provide appropriate, approved PFDs.
